PSHE


In PSHE we will be exploring how to be healthy and how to treat our body correctly through diet and exercise.


Hedgehogs and Porcupines

English

In English, Year 2 will be exploring 'The Way Home for Wolf'. We will:

- Creating a nature documentary
- Writing a poem
- Writing descriptions
- Write a narrative
- Create a comic strip



Mathematics

The topics from our White Rose Mathematics scheme for this term are:

- Multiplication
- Division
- Length and Height
- Mass and Capacity



Science

During Science lessons we will be looking at Plant Based Materials, we will be able to:

- Explain the terms reduce, reuse and recycle.
- Describe how paper is made.
- Select suitable materials for a plant pot.
- Describe good growth conditions for seeds.
- Make a plant pot from eco-friendly materials.
- Identify non-living materials to decorate a plant pot.



Basic Knowledge

This term, the children will be expected to complete addition, subtraction, money, shape and multiplication and division activities.

We will also focus on our weekly spellings.

Wider Curriculum- History

We will be looking at 'Monarchs'. We will be exploring:

- What a monarch is
- Monarchs within our lifetime
- Leeds Castle visit—looking at the layout of the castle
- The monarchs and history of Leeds Castle.

RE

In RE, Year 2 will be learning about **Salvation.** We will learn:

- Recognise that Incarnation and Salvation are part of a 'big story' of the Bible.
- Tell stories of Holy Week and Easter from the Bible and recognise a link with the idea of Salvation (Jesus rescuing people).
- Recognise that Jesus gives instructions about how to behave.
- Give at least three examples of how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus' death and resurrection in church worship at Easter.
- Think, talk and ask questions about whether the story of Easter has anything to say to them about sadness, hope or heaven, exploring different ideas.
