
Year 5 Term 4 Curriculum Booklet

English

This term, students will be developing their writing skills by exploring explanation texts, using David Livingstone's explorations as inspiration. They will learn how to structure clear and informative writing, using facts, technical vocabulary, and logical sequencing. Later in the term, we will shift our focus to poetry, using the theme of Earth and Space to inspire creative and descriptive writing. Students will experiment with different poetic forms and techniques to express ideas about the wonders of the universe.

Mathematics

The topics from our White Rose Mathematics scheme for this term are:

- Thousandths as decimals
- Thousandths on a place value chart
- Order and compare decimals (same number of decimal places)
- Round to the nearest whole number
- Equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages

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Weekly Freckle Tasks will continue to be set on a Friday.

Wider Curriculum: Science & Geography

In science, students will delve into the wonders of space, exploring the solar system, the movement of planets, and the role of gravity. They will learn about the Earth's rotation and how it causes day and night, as well as the Moon's phases and their effect on tides. Discussions will also cover space exploration, including famous missions and the future of space travel.

This term, students will explore the life and impact of David Livingstone, a famous explorer, missionary, and abolitionist. They will learn about his journeys through Africa, the challenges he faced, and his role in ending the transatlantic slave trade. Students will also develop map skills by tracing his routes and understanding African geography.

Music

Theme: The Holi festival

Through an engaging series of lessons, students will explore how music can be represented visually through colour and imagery. They will learn to create graphic scores and develop vocal compositions inspired by pictures. As the unit progresses, students will compose their own pieces based on colour themes, culminating in group performances that combine musical expression with creativity.
